A transition to Language Coach

Interview with Clarisse Roberte, English teacher, Brazil



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Can you describe your professional career before taking the language coaching certification (LCC)?

I worked as an English teacher for ten years, and for the last 4 years I taught English for business purposes.

How did you find the course?

I already sensed that the old methodologies used in the classroom were obsolete and we, as teachers, needed to do a more student-centered work. I just didn't know exactly how to do it. After the LCC course, this idea became much clearer and the work I should do was no longer a mystery. Now I know exactly what kind of techniques I should use.

Which highlights or insights did you gain from the LCC?

Many, but a very special one was that the student and I are partners in their journey to learn a new language, and I'm not supposed to tell them what to do. I give them options about activities, for example and they choose what they feel like doing.

What was the immediate impact on your way of teaching after taking the course?

It was tremendous! I started caring more about how my students feel and neuroscience became a part of the process I begin with each student. I invest some time in that subject during our sessions, and this makes the whole difference.

Were there any impacts on your personal life during or after the course?

Yes. I learned how to change some habits, the steps to take, considering how our brain works. I became a more confident and now I know better how to keep a habit going on is important to create new connections in my brain.

How has the course changed the way you deliver a language course?

I start with an interview using all the techniques learned in the course, free of charge, just like Rachel does, and I actually follow all the same next steps, from the setup of the schedule to the regular monitoring.

I feel they feel more confident to speak English, and that was the main goal I had when I started the course. I know more how to deal with their negative emotions.

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
