# A transition to Language Coach

Interview with Marie Claire Berkmans, English Teacher, France

## Can you describe your professional career before taking the language coaching certification (LCC)?

I worked as an English teacher in France for Education Nationale for 5 years and then resigned. I then worked for a language company for 5 yrs before setting up my own business. I have been an independent worker for 8 years now.

#### How did you find the course?

I was overly excited to take the LCC, there is not just one method to learn a language and as an NLP master practitioner I have been able to complete my knowledge with coaching techniques.

#### Which highlights or insights did you gain from the LCC?

I now realize how important it is to trigger success and "feelgood" hormones!

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#### What was the immediate impact on your way of teaching after taking the course?

I had never asked my clients how they were feeling, I keep getting feedback that it feels great to be asked!

#### Were there any impacts on your personal life during or after the course?

I ask how people are feeling more often (outside of English coaching) and I deal with my children's homework differently (those hormones (3)!)

### How would you describe your professional development after the course?

I think I had an epiphany as Margherita took us through the PACT PQC technique, it's not about lecturing, it's about experiencing.

#### How has the course changed the way you deliver a language course?

I felt like the pace was slower and I then realized that what matters most is my client's pace and not mine. I keep in mind how challenging it may be for an adult to go through a learning process again ( and be corrected...).

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
