Interview with Renata Kądziela, English Teacher, Poland

I was an English teacher in a secondary school and later self-employed. I used to teach children, teenagers and adults.

How did you find the course?

Which highlights or insights did you gain from the LCC?

The LCC has shown me various possibilities to make my teaching career more professional, more effective and prestigious.

What was the immediate impact on your way of teaching after taking the course?

I've become more active in listening, giving a lot of space to my students, which resulted in more fun-driven 'lessons', calm and full of engagement meetings. Even the way my learners perceived me has changed. Now, I'm their friend and authority at the same time. They feel comfortable and well-cared for, from now on. Before, I used to have nice and funny lessons but now, these are amazing, efficient and motivation-driven gatherings.

Were there any impacts on your personal life during or after the course?

I started analysing my own and my family members' behaviour. Being aware of the limbic system and the influence it has on our actions, I can more accurately respond to some situations. I've finally understood my daughters' struggles and therefore, I'm able to assist them in decision making or dealing with daily life.

How was your professional development after the course?

I started reading more about neuroscience, how the brain works and I even changed the way of creating my teaching materials.

How has the course changed the way you deliver a language course?

It's not teaching any more. I treat my 'lessons' as social meetings, lovely conversations and a possibility to change someone's attitude towards learning a language.

I think I show them that they're able to learn a language (at any age) and that it doesn't have to be a necessary evil.
